Budding SA youth international Kobamelo Kodisang is aiming to break into SC Branga's first team by January at

least, having joined the Portuguese giants' B-side at the start of the season.

Kodisang's switch to Braga came on the back of an impressive season at third-tier outfit AD Sanjoanense, where he was on loan from Bidvest Wits, last term.

The 20-year-old winger net-

ted five goals in 24 appearances for Sanjoanense, a feat that saw him being included in the Portuguese third-tier team of the season.

"I am still trying to adjust to the new life because Braga and Sanjoanense are two different teams. The philosophies and tactics are not the same, so I will need a few months to fully understand everything," Kodisang told Sowetan.

"I always make sure that I do everything that the coaches tell me to do. My aim is that by January I should be in the first team, playing regularly. But I won't put myself under unnecessary pressure."

Kodisang, who penned a three-year deal with Braga, also opened up about his lifestyle in Europe, revealing he hardly spends his leisure time outdoors as he's still familiarising himself with his new surroundings.

"I am always on [digital streaming service] Netflix because if I go out I don't know where to go. Sometimes I eat dinner out with my teammates, but it's rare that I go out," Kodisang said.

"I cannot lie, the food is not great... I miss my mom's pots, especially my favourite food, chicken. In Portugal they cook it differently and I always feel SA chicken is the best."

"In terms of the language [Portuguese], I am still struggling but I am learning it bit by bit."

## Pitso wants his men to win big

Mamelodi Sundowns will show no mercy on their hapless opponents in the CAF Champions League as the Brazilians aim to power into the group stages with a statement of intent.

Downs have a 5-0 advantage from the first leg over semi-professional side Cote d'Or, of the Seychelles.

The 2016 African champions were ruthless in the away match, thanks to a brace from Tiyani Mabunda and strikes from Lyle Lakay, Sibhelele Mkhulise and Wayne Arendse.

Ahead of the second leg at the Lucas Moripe Stadium on Friday (7pm), coach Pitso

Mosimane insinuated that a strong line-up will be fielded. "I'm not sure what I'll do because we need the confidence, I need the team to score goals," said Mosimane.

"You can see that we are not really the team that we know. I need my principles [to be adhered to]. So probably I will play the same team [from the first-leg] and let them score goals."

The Fishware giants should progress to the group phase unless the minnows from the island nation pull off a miracle. It will be Downs' fifth successive progression to the group stages of the premier continental competition.

The competition for places in the team has seen a number of players struggle for gametime.

After an impressive showing against Cote d'Or in the Seychelles, Andile Jali has

not made an appearance since.

Mosimane insisted that Jali will get his chance in future.

"Andile deserves to play and he played very well in Seychelles," he said.

"He deserves a chance to play and will probably play in the coming game."

Meanwhile, Uruguayan striker Mauricio Affonso is expected to return from an ankle injury next month.

Affonso was injured weeks after signing for the club in the pre-season. Mosimane relishes having the towering forward back to full fitness.

"We'll get Affonso after the break maybe. I signed him for when we go to meet the Al Ahlys of this world.

"He will come in handy at the right time."
