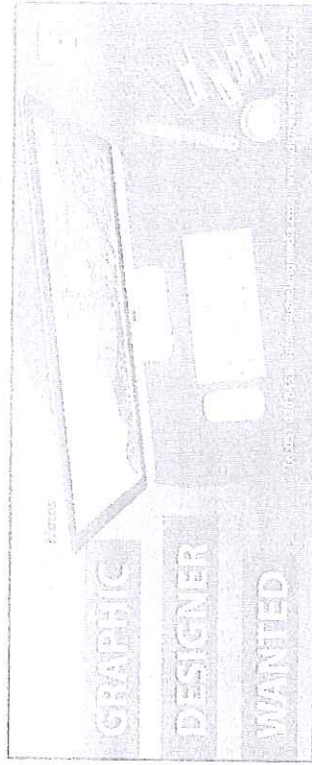
ANC finds 'MAP15' policy

FIFTEEN African National Congress councillors in the Mafikeng-A-Phofung local municipality – including its mayor Gilbert Mokotso – are faced with the possibility of seeing their membership being withdrawn. This comes after the party's provincial disciplinary committee found them guilty of misconduct last week. Mokotso and 14 other ANC councillors were suspended from party activities and the ANC council caucus in June this year for colluding with the opposition. According to party provincial spokesperson, Thabo Meeke, the committee has given councillors 14 days to appeal the DC's verdict to the party's national head office, failing which, their membership will be withdrawn from the party subsequently from the council. "All councillors will continue working at the municipality as councillors pending their appeal to national office after they were found guilty of undermining the party's constitution and misconduct," said Meeke.

This happened after former mayor Vusi Tshabalala's recall by the organisation's Provincial Task Team in May this year, together with Chief Whip Mmoleli Moloi and the Speaker Malewatle Nthedi.

The 15 councillors are said to have defied the party by electing Mokotso as the new mayor without the party's approval and further retained both Moloi and Nthedi to their position as Chief Whip and Speaker respectively during the municipal council meeting. The decision is further said to cause more rift among the rung party members in the already wounded maluti sub-region with some members blaming the provincial leadership for creating divisions and holding on to the internal factions ahead of the party's December national conference in Nasrec. However, should the councillors fail to appeal or lose their case at the national office, the municipality will face the by-elections in which all parties will contest their wards followed by elections of the new municipal council election. According to the political analyst, Dr Sethulego Matebesi, the move might turn out to be suicidal for the ruling party going into by-elections.

"If they (ANC) go to by-elections, it might turn out to be suicidal for them because there might be a possibility that the opposition parties might obtain seats from the ANC," said Matebesi.
